
The Challenge

Habitat Area




Sage Grouse Lek Decline




The Threats

Barbed Wire Low-flying sage grouse are often killed in fence collisions



An Immediate Solution

Sage Grouse collisions with barbed wire fences can cause injury or death.

Applying <u>highly visible markers</u> every three feet to wire fences near

areas with large grouse populations can *reduce collision rates by up to 83 percent*.
